Heaven Touching Earth

Genesis 28:17

"this is none other than the house of God and this it the gate of heaven."

The above verse is the response to Jacob's vision of a ladder with angels ascending to heaven and descending to earth. In the account Jacob is sent away by his father Isaac to escape the wrath of his brother Esau and to build a new life amongst his father's relatives. Jacob whose name means supplanter or deceiver, has good reason to be on the run. He colludes with his mother to deceive both his brother and his father to secure the inheritance of the first born son.

The vision of the ladder reveals that though mindful of our sinful condition, God is always providing us with a route back to heaven through his son Jesus Christ. Patriarchs and Prophets page 183, puts it this way:

"In the vision the plan of redemption was presented to Jacob, not fully, but in such parts as were essential to him at that time. The mystic ladder revealed to him in his dream was the same to which Christ referred in His conversation with Nathanael. Said He, "Ye shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man." John 1:51."

The ladder is God's way for us to make it into the kingdom. Prayer, the divine communication tool does not require a mobile phone, an internet service or cables to access God: he neither slumbers nor sleeps and is waiting for our call. Even when we are at a loss to speak, we have the Holy Spirit- the Comforter and Counsellor who can translate our groans into the language of heaven.

"Before they call, I will answer, and while they are yet speaking, I will hear" (Isaiah 65:24), is what our Heavenly Father assures us, so we need not fret about the timeliness of his answer. We are counselled to ask, according to his will, with sincerity and humility and God promises that he will supply all our needs.

Let us learn from Jacob's ladder and realise what a compassionate Saviour we have. Rather than run away and hide, let us approach the Throne of Grace without delay knowing that God will make the surrounding environment- a Bethel and our very prayers- a gateway which leads to heaven.

Dear Heavenly Father thank you for making a way for us erring human beings to connect with heaven 24/7. We are grateful that through the divine ladder of prayer, your will can be done on earth as it is in heaven and you can make it Bethel wherever we are. Your nature is to love, forgive and bless, teach us how to do the same. We ask in the name of your beloved son, Jesus Christ our Saviour, amen.

Keys To A Praying Church

The call for revival and reformation is as relevant now as it was in biblical times. The church as a body of believers can provide a critical mass to begin the process of revival through one means and one means alone-PRAYER.

Examples of revival and reformation in the bible are evidenced in Ezra and Nehemiah in the Old Testament and the book of Acts in the New Testament. Christian revivalist movements can also be found in every century since the early church. Though the Adventist Movement was birthed through much prayer, revival is still as necessary in these modern times, as it was then.

In selected Messages page 121, Sister White tells us: "A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work."

According to J. Edwin Orr, who has made a lifetime study of prayer movements in the church, "there is a greater movement of prayer growing now than ever before in history". His studies conclude that "whenever God sets about to do a new thing, he always sets his people praying."

What can the local church do to grow strong in prayer? Why should you make prayer a priority in your church ministry?

Alvin Vander Griend presents eight keys to prayer for developing a church to be a house of prayer:

- **1. Praying Leaders are essential.** Praying leaders develop praying churches. Power for ministry can only be released through prayer.
- 2. Give Prayer a high priority in the church's life and ministry. Jesus is our example and prayer had a priority in his life. How important is prayer to the church?
- Correct thinking about prayer is important. If we understand how prayer fits into God's rule of our lives, we are more likely to give prayer its rightful place.
- 4. Clear communication about needs and answers is vital. It is important to share prayer needs and answers within the church so that members can see that it works.
- 5. Prayer should be linked to ministry. God has called us to pray to obtain a blessing and to be a blessing. A church strong in prayer will know how to link it to ministry.
- 6. Make times, ways and places for people to pray together. Praying with others teaches, enriches strengthens us and multiplies our blessings.
- **7. Encourage personal devotions.** Private prayer is and indispensable part of every Christian's life.
- **8. Encourage family devotions.** Deuteronomy 6:6-9 reminds us that parents are responsible for spiritual training of their children.

God has chosen prayer as the key whereby his church can do his work. Through prayer we can impact the world.
